

PESTA SUKAN 2026 – FLOORBALL GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Rules

The competition shall be conducted in accordance with the existing laws of the game as approved by the International Floorball Federation (IFF) and adopted by the Singapore Floorball Association (SFA).

2. Venue and Schedule

All matches will be held at Our Tampines Hub, Team Sports Hall, on weekends between **11 July to 2 August 2026**.

4. Registration and Eligibility of Players

Entry is open to all Singapore Citizens and Permanent Residents. Non-residents are allowed to participate but should not exceed 30% of the total number of registered players per team.

Each team may register a minimum and maximum number of players listed on the next page, inclusive of goalkeepers. Players are not allowed to represent more than one (1) team when playing within the same category. Any findings during registration, we will seek clarification from the Team Managers. Any findings during the competition itself will warrant sending off of the player and possible disqualification of the team's match or tournament, subject to the Organising Committee's final decision.

For all categories, **except for the Pro Men's Open and Pro Women's Open**, a maximum of two (2) National Team players is allowed per team.

For the **Pro Men's Open and Pro Women's Open categories**, no National Team players are allowed. A maximum of two (2) Premier League players is allowed per team.

Definition of National Team players refer to individuals who are carded and/or have represented the country in international competitions between 1 January 2025 and 30 June 2026, including the following:

- (W) World Floorball Championships AOFC Qualification 2025
- (M) Under-19 World Floorball Championships 2025
- (M) AOFC Cup 2025
- (W) The World Games 2025
- (W) World Floorball Championships 2025
- (M) SEA Games 2025
- (W) SEA Games 2025
- (W) Under-19 World Floorball Championships AOFC Qualification 2026
- (M) World Floorball Championships AOFC Qualification 2026
- (W) Under-19 World Floorball Championships 2026
- (M) 3v3 World Floorball Championships 2026
- (W) 3v3 World Floorball Championships 2026

Definition of Premier League players refer to individuals who have participated in the 25/26 SFL Premier League.

The Team Manager shall submit the finalized team list before the start of their first match.

Teams must be represented by a Team Manager during the course of a match.

5. Competition Rules

The competition shall be conducted in accordance with the existing laws of the game as approved by the International Floorball Federation (IFF) and adopted by the Singapore Floorball Association (SFA).

Competition Format

A minimum of four (4) teams are required for the category to be played.

By default, the tournament will be played in a group stage followed by knockout rounds format. Grouping of teams for the preliminary round shall be first based on a random team draw conducted before the start of the competition. Knockout rounds format will be determined once the number of registered teams are in.

3v3 w mini goalpost: 3 players vs 3 players on court, use of mini goalpost

4v4 w mini goalpost: 4 players vs 4 players on court, use of mini goalpost

3v3: 3 players + 1 goalkeeper vs 3 players + 1 goalkeeper on court, use of big goalpost

4v4: 4 players + 1 goalkeeper vs 4 players + 1 goalkeeper on court, use of big goalpost

5v5: 5 players + 1 goalkeeper vs 5 players + 1 goalkeeper on court, use of big goalpost

Starting Time

Please refer to “Pesta Sukan 2026 Floorball Fixtures” document which will be sent after confirmation of teams.

Teams are required to report to the competition venue minimum 30 minutes before the start of their first match of the day.

Players' Attendance

Points

The competition shall be played in a round robin league system during the group phase with the points system as follows:

- 3 POINTS: Awarded to winner of the match
- 1 POINT: Awarded to teams involved in a draw
- 0 POINT: Awarded to losing team of the match

The ranking within a group shall be decided in the following order:

- (i) Total number of points
- (ii) Goal difference
- (iii) Goal scored
- (iv) Head-to-Head

During the knockout stages, for all categories, **except the Elite Men's Open, Pro Men's Open, Elite Women's Open, and Pro Women's Open**, if a match ends in a draw at the end of regulation time, a sudden death extra time will be played. If no goal is scored during extra time, the match will proceed to penalty shots, to be taken in an alternating sequence by both teams. If the scores remain tied after three (3) penalty shots each, the sudden death rule will apply.

Sudden Death Extra Time will be given as follows for each category:

- Masters Mixed Open / Special Olympics: 3 min
- U10 / U12 / U14 / U17: 4 min
- U19: 5 mins

For the **Elite Men's Open, Pro Men's Open, Elite Women's Open, and Pro Women's Open**, if a match ends in a draw at the end of regulation time, the match shall be decided with penalty shots. If the scores remain tied after three (3) penalty shots each, the sudden death rule will apply.

Postponement

In case of postponement due to unforeseen circumstances, ALL of the following conditions must be met before the remaining time of the match is played at a later time:

- (i) Both teams must either be in a draw situation OR with ONE (1) goal difference in scores.
- (ii) There must be at least 30 seconds or more in the LAST period of the match when the match is interrupted.
- (iii) The remaining time of the match will start with a face-off. Any team which refuses to play the remaining time of the game under the above circumstances will be deemed to have forfeited the game. The opposing team will be awarded a walkover and the **score line of 5-0** will be awarded to the opposing team.

Walkover

Teams shall concede a walkover if they fail to turn up 3 minutes after the scheduled time of play. The opposing team will be awarded a walkover and the **score line of 5-0** will be awarded to the opposing team.

If an ineligible player was found to be fielded, the matches he/she participated in will be considered as a loss and the **score line of 5-0** will be awarded to the opposing team.

Sending Offs

If a player has been issued a “**Match Penalty**”, he/she shall take no further part in the match and be asked to leave the competition venue hall with immediate effect. The player will also be suspended from the following match(es) in the tournament. A disciplinary committee will be convened in the quickest time possible to decide on any further action against the player.

Equipment

Teams are to prepare 2 distinct coloured tops. Avoid Grey coloured tops as it clashes with the referees.

All goalkeepers shall be dressed in proper floorball goalkeeper trousers and wear a facemask approved by the IFF and marked accordingly.

The stick shall be approved by the IFF and marked accordingly.

Note: Inspection of equipment may take place before and during the match. Incorrect equipment discovered before the match shall be corrected by the player concerned, after which he may start the match. All incorrect equipment discovered during the match shall lead to the prescribed penalty being determined by the referee.

Protest

In the event of any dispute arising over any player(s) and/or any team, the match shall be played under protest, and the Organising Committee shall determine the matter on receipt of the protest in writing, together with the prescribed protest fees.

Protests must be made in writing together with the protest fee of S\$100.00 and lodged with the Organising Committee on the spot during the match. In the event of the protest being dismissed, the fee will be forfeited.

The decision arising from any protest shall be final and there shall be no appeal.

6. First Aid and Medical Coverage

Teams shall be responsible for their basic first aid and medical issues. Medics will be on site if further medical attention is required.

7. Prize Presentation

The prize presentation ceremony will be held immediately after the completion of the final match. The team managers are to ensure that their teams are present to collect the prizes.

8. Others

The Organising Committee reserves the right to decide on any issues raised that are not stated in the general rules and regulations. All decisions made by the Organising Committee are final.

The Organising Committee has the right to alter the scheduled time and dates of the tournament if necessary. Participating teams will be informed of the changes through notifications to Team Managers. All decisions made by the Organising Committee are final.
