1 General Rules

- 1.1 According to the latest Rules and Regulations of the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) and as directed by the Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA).
- 1.2 Governed by the Get Active! Singapore Pesta Sukan 2026 – General Rules and Regulations.

2 Events, Eligibility & Registration Fees

2.3 Team Eligibility

2.3.1 Each team must consist of at least 5 players and maximum of 6 players and is mandatory to field a minimum of one female player per team.

2.3.2 Minimum of 70% of the registered players must be Singapore Citizen (SC) and/or Permanent Resident (PR) and maximum 30% of the registered players can be non-SC/PR. I.e. Up to only 1 player per team can be non-SC/PR.

3 **Event Venue & Schedule**

3.1 All matches will be held at Jurong East Sports Centre, Sports & Cultural Centre. The detailed schedule is as follows:

4 **Competition Format**

4.1 Individual Event Format

4.1.1 Competition will be played in 2 stages:

4.1.2 Stage 1: Qualifying Stage

- Entries will be drawn into groups of 3 or 4 (depending on the final entries received) for each event.
- Each group will play a round robin.
- Top 2 from each group will advance to Stage 2.
- Group final ranking shall be determined according to ITTF guidelines.
- Matches to be decided by best of 3 or best of 5 games of 11 points, to be determined after the closing of entries.

4.1.3 Stage 2: Main Draw

- Single knock-out elimination format
- Matches to be decided by best of 5 games of 11 points.

4.2 Team Event Format

4.2.1 Competition will be played in 2 stages:

4.2.2 Stage 1: Qualifying Stage

- Entries will be drawn into groups of 3 or 4 (depending on the final entries received) for each event.
- Each group will play a round robin.
- Top 2 from each group will advance to Stage 2.
- Group final ranking shall be determined according to ITTF guidelines.

4.2.3 Stage 2: Main Draw

- Single knock-out elimination format

4.2.4 Matches are to be decided by best of 3 games of 11 points or best of 5 games of 11 points, to be confirmed after closing of entries.

4.2.5 Open Team event consists of 3 matches, 2 Doubles and 1 Singles in the following match order:

S/N	Match Order
1	1 st Doubles Open
2	Singles Open
3	2 nd Doubles Open

4.2.6 Each team must register minimum of 5 players and maximum of 6 players. It is mandatory to register a minimum of one female player.

4.2.7 Players are not allowed to repeat. It is mandatory to field at least one female player in the 1st Doubles Open [1] or Singles Open [2] match in the Team Line Up. **The female player must be present to play her match.** The team shall concede the entire team match if the fielded female player does not turn up for her match.

4.2.8 Each team may field up to a maximum of 1 non-SC/PR player in the Team Line Up of each team match.

4.3 Fixtures

4.3.1 Seedings will be based on competition results of Get Active! Singapore Pesta Sukan 2024 organised by Sport Singapore. Participants who have not participated in the above-mentioned competition will be un-seeded.

5 Prize Money and Medals

5.1 Medals and Prize monies will be awarded to the top 3 positions of each event with at least 8 entries.

5.2 In the team event, the Champion team will be awarded with a trophy.

5.3 Only Medals will be awarded when there are less than 4 entries in the event i.e. 3 or less entries.

5.4 If there are only 3 entries for the event, 'minus 1 rule' applies, i.e. only 1st & 2nd positions will be awarded with medals but no prize money. The same 'minus 1 rule' applies if there are only 2 entries for the event, i.e. only the 1st position will be awarded with medal and not prize money.

5.5 In the event that there are less than 4 entries, participants may choose 1 of the following options:

Option 1 – Participants may withdraw and receive a full refund

Option 2 – Participants may continue with the competition but will not be eligible for prize money. Medals will be awarded based on the 'minus 1 rule'.

Option 3 – Participants may opt to join another category which they are eligible for.

6 Walkover

6.1 Individual Event

6.1.1 Participant(s) shall concede a walkover if they fail to be present on court when the match is called to play. There shall be no grace period.

6.2 Team Event

6.2.1 A team shall concede a walkover if player/s for the individual match do not report at the scheduled time.

7 **Supplementary Rules**

7.1 Players are allowed to register for a **maximum of 1 individual event for table tennis**.

7.2 All players are requested to produce their Identity Card/Student Card for registration on the day of the competition.

7.3 The ITTF approved 3-Star 40+ mm **white** balls shall be used during the Tournament. No **white** apparels or clothing (shirt and shorts) are allowed. Players who fail to conform shall be disqualified.

7.4 In the team event and doubles event, players are required to wear similar attire as a team/pair for their matches.

7.5 Team lineup will be filled automatically by the referee team in order of the team registration list if the lineup is not submitted 5 minutes before the scheduled match time.

7.6 In the event where para player/s participate in able-bodied categories, para rules shall apply.

7.7 Umpires will be provided for all matches for 9 & Under category and only from Quarter-finals onwards for all other categories. Players are required to be the scorekeeper when umpires are not provided.

7.8 The Prize Presentation Ceremony shall be held soon after the finals of the events. All prize winners **MUST** be present personally at the ceremony in neat attire (no singlet, slippers and sandals) in order to receive the prize. Failing which, the Organising Committee reserves the right not to award the medal and trophy.

7.9 Each player/pair is allowed to have an accompanying coach to provide side coaching for their match(es).

7.10 Players are not allowed to use mobile devices to make or take calls at all times during their match(es).

7.11 Registration deadline is on 21 June 2026.

7.12 Draws for the competition shall be conducted on 5 July 2026. The draws shall be conducted by the referee team, witnessed by ActiveSG Staff and Technical team.

- 7.13 Master Schedule draws and fixtures shall be published on 9 July 2026 at Pesta Sukan website. ActiveSG would not be sending notifications with regards to the schedule and fixtures. Participants are required to check their match timings on their own accord.
- 7.14 All players are required to sign an indemnity form prior to their participation in the competition. In addition, participants aged 16 years and below are required to submit a Parental Consent Form. In the event if the indemnity form is not submitted before the start of his/her first match, the player will not be allowed to play in the match.
- 7.15 In the event of any dispute, the match shall be played under protest. The Organising Committee shall determine the matter on receipt of the protest in writing, together with a protest fee (amount as stated in the Get Active! Singapore Pesta Sukan 2025 – General Rules and Regulations), within one hour after the match. The decision of the Organising Committee shall be final and there shall be no further appeal.
- 7.16 The Organising Committee has the rights to include, amend or exclude any of the above terms and conditions without any prior notice.

1 General Rules

- 1.1 According to the latest Rules and Regulations of the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) and as directed by the Singapore Table Tennis Association (STTA) and Table Tennis Association for the Disabled, Singapore (TTADS).
- 1.2 Governed by the Get Active! Singapore Pesta Sukan 2025 - General Rules and Regulations.

2 Events, Eligibility & Registration Fees

2.1 Events & Registration Fees

SportSG reserves the right to combine the classification categories after evaluating the number of participating entries.

- 2.1.1 Participants are required to strictly adhere to their classification categories and indicate their classification category during registration.

2.2 Eligibility

2.2.1 Participants who are not disabled classified (Refer to the International Table Tennis Federation (ITTF) Classification Code) will be required to write in to the Organising Committee with documentation of all medical reports and letters.

3 Event Venue & Schedule

3.1 All matches will be held at Jurong East Sports Centre. The schedule is as follows:

4 Competition Format

4.1 Competition will be played in 2 stages:

4.1.1 Stage 1: Qualifying Stage

- Entries will be drawn into groups of 3 or 4 (depending on the final entries received) for each event.
- Each group will play a round robin.
- Top 2 from each group will advance to Stage 2.
- Group final ranking shall be determined according to ITTF guidelines.

4.1.2 Stage 2: Main Draw

- Single knock-out elimination format

4.1.3 All matches in both stages are to be decided by best of 5 games of 11 points.

4.2 Fixtures

4.2.1 Seeding will be based on the competition results of Get Active! Singapore Pesta Sukan 2023 organised by Sport Singapore. Participants who have not participated in the above-mentioned competition will be un-seeded.

5 Prize Money and Medals

5.1 Medals and Prize monies will be awarded to the top 3 positions of each event with at least 8 entries.

- 5.2 Only Medals will be awarded when there are less than 4 entries in the event i.e. 3 or less entries.
- 5.3 If there are only 3 entries for the event, 'minus 1 rule' applies, i.e. only 1st & 2nd positions will be awarded with medals but no prize money. The same 'minus 1 rule' applies if there are only 2 entries for the event, i.e. only the 1st position will be awarded with medal and not prize money.
- 5.4 In the event that there are less than 4 entries, participants may choose 1 of the following options:
- Option 1
- Participants may withdraw and receive a full refund
- Option 2
- Participants may continue with the competition but will not be eligible for prize money. Medals will be awarded based on the 'minus 1 rule'.
- Option 3
- Participants may opt to join another category which they are eligible for.

6 Walkover

- 6.1 Participant(s) shall concede a walkover if they fail to be present on court when the match is called to play after a grace period of ten (10) minutes.

7 Supplementary Rules

- 7.1 For wheelchair category from Class 1 to Class 5, all wheelchairs used for competition should be manual unless prior approval is given to use electric powered wheelchair. Those seeking to use electric powered wheelchair would need to provide supporting documents from medical doctors. Approval for use of electric powered wheelchair is at the discretion of the Organising Committee. Such approval can be sought by writing in to the Organising Committee.
- 7.2 All players are requested to produce their Identity Card/Student Card for registration on the day of the competition.
- 7.3 The ITTF approved 3-Star 40+ mm **white** balls shall be used during the Tournament. No **white** apparels or clothing (shirt and shorts) are allowed. Players who fail to conform shall be disqualified.
- 7.4 The Prize Presentation Ceremony shall be held soon after the finals of the events. All prize winners **MUST** be present personally at the ceremony in neat attire (no singlet,

slippers and sandals) in order to receive the prize. Failing which, the Organising Committee reserves the right not to award the medal and trophy.
